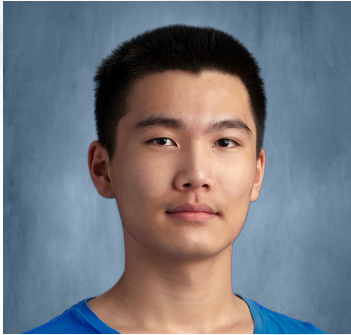

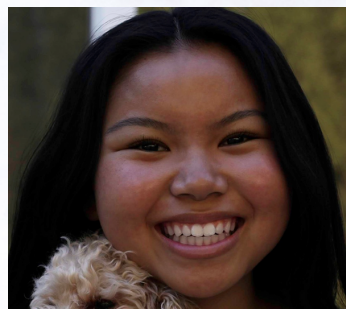

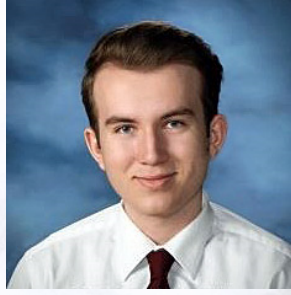
DAVIS SENIOR HIGH SCHOOL PTA SENIOR AWARDS

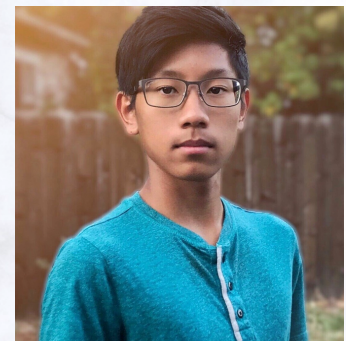

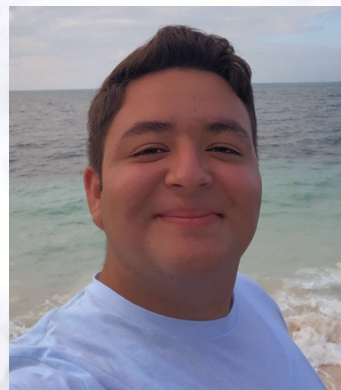
MARY ELLEN DOLCINI MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS

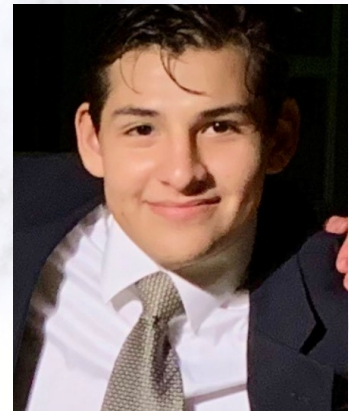
